4. Principal's Report - Jeff Gervais

Student Council met today. There were some new and different ideas depending on the class. The spirit day next Friday will be "Identical Day". The grade 7 and 8s will be going to Earl to see the "Legally Blonde" production. The grade 8s were invited by Earl to attend their school dance on Friday Mar 11th.

There are **4 DPA bags** scattered throughout the school. They have been strategically placed for students and teachers to use...thank you School council. Jeff has placed pictures on the school blog.

School Clothing: Harry and Mr. Thorp are researching the clothing and sportswear options. They have chosen "The Sam Group". They will standardize our school clothing and sportswear, in the gold and black colours. The cost of 60 pinneys and 60 jerseys and a school banner will be approximately \$2675.00. The money generated from popcorn sales (\$1000.00) will help pay for the items, and Jeff will cover the rest. The cost of the clothing is to be determined. The approximate sale cost will be \$10 - \$13 for t shirts, \$12 - \$15 for long sleeve t shirts, \$26 - \$29 for a hoodie. The school will be sending out order forms and collecting the money, in March some time. The second round of ordering will take place in Sept. There was some discussion about how to help kids pick out a size. There are a limited supply of sample shirts.

Toonie Tuesday: The final tally of money collected by the school is \$353.40. Council pledged to match upto \$500.00. Motion by Claudette for Council to donate \$500 so that Jeff can add this to the school total. Seconded by Rebecca, all in favour. Teri to add a blog post.

April 15 PD day: Ron and Jeff have made plans for the staff to get together for part of the day. Both schools will do a joint staff meeting. They will discuss Health and Safety training, and a wellness component. The Luv to Groove workshop will play a role as well. Will the Councils provide food? Megan to talk to Ron and Carole.

School Learning Plan: There was a late start to the process due to the labour issues at the beginning of the year. Jeff is discussing with staff how to manage the process.
